Andrew Lamond graduated from the University of Newcastle with First Class Honours, as well as receiving the AIA Annual Chapter Prize. On graduation he worked for Suters Architects while maintaining an interest in architectural education as a Design Tutor at the Department of Architecture in Newcastle. Along with another graduate, he set up his own architectural practice, Herd, which was responsible for a number of small-scale though significant design commissions. Andrew returned to Australia in 2003 and joined lahnimmo architects as a senior architect. Since joining the practice Andrew has become an integral part of the team, being appointed an Associate Director in 2007. Andrew has been Project Architect on several significant projects, including new public amenities buildings for Centennial Parklands, which received an Architecture Award for Public Buildings from the AIA NSW Chapter 2006. More recently Andrew was Project Architect for the new \$100 Mil Lowy Cancer Research Centre at the University of New South Wales and took the project from competition stage right through to client handover.

Andrew's strengths lie in his ability to imagine and communicate sophisticated architectural concepts through his natural talent in drawing in addition to being able to extract successful architectural solutions from difficult and at times unpromising design problems. He has a strong interest in the tectonics of architecture as a means of design expression, and is equally comfortable working on small and intimate projects as he is on large urban design projects.

Andrew also maintains an active interest in architectural education and frequently attends juries at the University of Sydney and NSW.
